Sunscreen sprays

Coppertone is recalling five types of aerosol sunscreen spray because benzene was detected. Benzene exposure can cause cancer in humans, but daily exposure to levels of benzene detected in the spray is not expected to cause health problems. Disinfection wand

The Food and Drug Administration is warning consumers not to use the Max-Lux Safe-T-Lite UV handheld germicidal wand because it emits a level of radiation that is more than 3,000 times stronger than the ultraviolet exposure limit. Infant loungers

The Boppy Company is recalling Boppy original and preferred newborn loungers and Pottery Barn Kids Boppy newborn loungers. Infants can suffocate if they roll, move or are placed in the lounger in a position

that obstructs breathing or if they roll off the lounger onto soft bedding or a pillow that obstructs breathing.
