The [AAP election](#) is underway with voting taking place from Sept. 13-27.

David L. Hill, M.D., FAAP, of Wilmington, N.C., and Susan J. Kressly, M.D., FAAP, of Sanibel, Fla., are running for AAP president-elect. The winner will serve as president in 2025.

In addition, four candidates are running for two at-large positions on the AAP Board of Directors:

- Seat A representing pediatric medical subspecialists: Angela M. Ellison, M.D., FAAP, of Philadelphia, and Lily J. Lou, M.D., FAAP, of Palos Park, Ill.;
- Seat B representing pediatric surgical specialists: Kirk Reichard, M.D., FAAP, of Wilmington, Del., and Kristina W. Rosbe, M.D., FAAP, of San Francisco.

The at-large members will be seated on the Board of Directors on Jan. 1, 2024.
