SUPPLEMENTS TO PEDIATRICS

CERTAIN comprehensive investigations, as well as considerations of some subjects, justly require lengthy presentation. Such thoroughness on the part of authors deserves encouragement. The total pages of editorial text which can be made available to serve all authors and the diverse purposes of this type of medical journal are limited by many circumstances. Whenever manuscripts require more than 20 printed pages in PEDIATRICS, the right of other authors to prompt publication and a balanced assortment of material in the journal are threatened.

A substantial part of the cost of publishing this journal is borne by the subscribers. Regular publication of lengthy manuscripts from contributors would mean an increase in the price of the journal to subscribers, often for material which has unquestioned fundamental value but is of restricted interest.

In order to encourage the scholarly effort which deserves publication in full, but is not of a length suitable for a monograph, PEDIATRICS offers an outlet through the familiar device of Supplements.

Manuscripts considered appropriate for publication as Supplements to PEDIATRICS should preferably be based on a related series of investigations or a single topic and of such a length as to require 32 to 96 pages in print.

Supplements will appear as Part II of a

regular issue of PEDIATRICS and will be distributed to all subscribers simultaneous with the regular issue at no extra cost. This Second Part may contain more than one of the shorter Supplements, particularly if devoted to the same or a related subject.

The Editorial policies and procedures which govern the text of a regular issue will apply to the Supplement, except for charges to the author and privileges concerning offprints and reprints.

Authors of unsolicited manuscripts must bear the actual cost of publication; quotations will be provided upon submission of the manuscript to the Editor. If this form of publication is anticipated in preparation of budgets in support of research, the cost will not prove prohibitive.

Fifty copies of a Supplement will be provided free to the senior author, in keeping with the present policy of PEDIATRICS (see page on General Information in each regular issue).

Single copies, in limited supply, will be available for purchase from the Central Office of the American Academy of Pediatrics at the price designated in each Supplement.

Larger orders of the Supplements may be obtained only by permission of the author, Editor and Publisher, in accordance with customary arrangements and by special quotation.

PEDIATRICS is owned and controlled by the American Academy of Pediatrics, Inc. It is issued monthly by Charles C Thomas, Publisher, 301-327 East Lawrence Avenue, Springfield, Illinois.
